


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

Co-brands – Producer responsibility

Example scenarios from Ecology's eCycle program:

- There were TVs sold as <u>SpongeBob</u>. Even though Emerson Radio Corp is cobranded and shown on the back of the TV, Nickelodeon registered. They are the owner of SpongeBob and didn't contest registration. It was sold as a Nickelodeon SpongeBob TV.
- There were DC Comic <u>Batman</u> TVs. DC Comics/Warner Brothers refused to register and felt the responsible party was Emerson Radio Corp (similar to the SpongeBob TV). They felt the Batman logo is just "art" and not a brand. They were considered non-compliant since they wouldn't register.
- There were Google <u>Nexus</u> branded tablets cobranded with Asus. We negotiated between Google and Asus and required Google to register because Nexus was the dominant brand.



Plastic aerosol containers

§ 178.33b-6 (a) Each container must be <u>manufactured</u> by thermoplastic processes that will assure uniformity of the completed container. No used material other than production <u>residues</u> or regrind from the same manufacturing process may be used. The <u>packaging</u> must be adequately resistant to aging and to degradation caused either by the substance contained or by ultraviolet radiation.

§ 178.33b-5 Material.(a) The <u>receptacles</u> must be constructed of polyethylene terephthalate (PET), polyethylene napthalate (PEN), polyamide (Nylon) or a blend of PET, PEN, ethyl vinyl alcohol (EVOH) and/or Nylon.
(b) Material with seams, cracks, laminations or other injurious <u>defects</u> are forbidden.
